## Discussion Guide

**Main Idea:** God will ultimately defeat and destroy all enemies and the Lamb will reign with His saints.

### CONNECTING

Why are we so interested in the future? When have you wondered what the future holds for you and those you love? Randy asked and answered three questions related to Revelation's view of the future. Did you agree or disagree? Why?

Read Revelation 19:6-10. Who is the bride of Christ and how does the bride feel about the bridegroom? Read more about the groom in Revelation 19:11-16. How does this description of Jesus compare with your image of Him from the Gospels? What do we learn from this revelation of Jesus?

### UNDERSTANDING

Read Revelation 16:12-16 and then 19:17-21. Are these two battles the same? Who is gathered for war? How are these armies defeated?

Read Revelation 20:1-10 which describes the 1000-year reign of Christ. Why is Satan bound, and by whom? What did his temporary binding accomplish? What is the "first resurrection" and the "second death"? Why do you think Satan will try to deceive the nations one more time? What is the final fate of the beast, false prophet and Satan? What does this mean for the spiritual battle you fight every day?

Read Revelation 20:11-15. What is happening in this scene? What does it say about human nature? What is the result of the rebellion? How should we live, in light of verse 15?

### LIVING

In light of Judgment Day, how can we be sure our name is in the book of life and that we are ready for it? Reading John 5:24 and Ephesians 2:8-10, how can we be sure we know Christ?

How can looking forward to the 1000-year-reign of Christ help us make it through difficult days? How can we encourage one another this week in our battle with sin and remembering our true identity?

**Assignment:** Read EFCA Statement #9 aloud: *We believe in the personal, bodily and premillennial return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The coming of Christ, at a time known only to God, demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service and energetic mission.* How does the Second Coming of Christ affect the way you worship Him today? How will this motivate us to "godly living, sacrificial service and energetic mission? Close with prayer for each other's needs and that God's final judgment will motivate us to share the gospel with urgency.
